We are writing in response to your email received by Post Office Limited ("Post Office") on 12 September 2025, which has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("FOIA").

In your email, you have requested the information shown verbatim in bold below:

"What progress has the Working Group made on the issues discussed in Mel Parkes witness statement and oral evidence? Specifically p.142.15 think the review is currently underway, so a Working Group that has been established, and we are looking at all of the things that need to be true, as part of that potential recovery process. And an independent review, or a body that has independent people, maybe postmasters or former postmasters, whether that should be created to review these, yes. and p. 171.13 think we could be more overt with our current position in the policy and in some of the communications that we have with postmasters during the investigation process.

You're right.

Q. Our position is that the policy should be reviewed; do you accept that it should be reviewed -- A. Absolutely -- Q. -- and changed?

A. -- and we will take that, definitely. Have these reviews taken place and what were the findings? If not when are they likely too? Who sits on the Panel considering the SPM Contract, how frequently do they meet and what are the topics for discussion?"

We have interpreted your request as asking for information relating to any working group(s) or independent panel(s) considering postmaster contracts.

We can confirm that Post Office does not hold the information you have requested.

On Page 141, line 15 of oral evidence there is mention of a 'Working Group'. This is in relation to an independent panel which was being considered as part of reviewing Post Office's model for recovering shortfalls. Post Office is currently only recovering losses via a voluntary process (and not pursuing recovery via any civil process) which means we have, as yet, had no reason to set up this panel.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of this response, you do have a right to request an internal review.
